- DOJ Practice Patterns Scott Stout, Sabrina Taylor, Seth Zacharias Phx Police Dept
 - DOJ placed Phx PD under DOJ Investigation
 - DOJ would like feedback from the community 866.432.0335 or Phoenix.Community@usdoj.govPhoenix.community@usdoj.gov
 - Aug 5th the investigation
 - Civil Rights Division launched a standard investigation called a pattern and Practice investigation for 5 Focus Areas
 - 1. Whether the Phx PD uses excessive force in violation of the 4th Amendment
 - 2. Whether the phoenix PD engages in discriminatory policing practices that violate the Constitution and federal law
 - 3. Whether the Dep violates the 1st amendment by retaliation against individuals who are engaged in protected expressive activities
 - 4. Whether the City and its PD respond to people w/ disabilities in a manner that violates the ADA. (do you divert them to services or go directly to criminal detainment). This includes whether decisions to criminally detain individuals w behavioral health disabilities are proper
 - 5. Whether the PD Dept violates the rights of individuals experiencing homelessness, by seizing and disposing of their belongings in a manner that violates the Constitution

- Why? DOJ stated "Open Source" investigative leads
- Time Frame? DOJ stated the time frame is dependent on dept size and cooperation w/ the investigative process. Possibly 12-18 mo.
- How? DOJ stated that investigations generally follow this format:
 - Phase 1. Will be information gathering (initial Data request received)
 - Phase 2 will be voluntary Civil investigation interviews (unknown time frame)
 - Command Staff
 - City Leadership
 - Officers/Sergeants/Lieutenants/PLEA/PPSLA
 - Community Stakeholders
- Other Municipal Dept Investigations
- o Info avail. On the DOJ website:
 - As of 2017 the DOJ had investigated 69 dept since 1997
 - **2008-2016**
 - Opened 23 Investigations
 - 6 w/o finding Constitutional Violations
 - Actively Enforcing w/ Agreements
- To keep you informed, we would like to let you know that the US Dept of Justice is conducting a Civil Pattern or Practice inquiry into the Phx PD. The dept welcomes this inquiry to help us understand how we can better serve the community
- Short Term Rentals Kate Bauer of AZ Neighborhood Alliance 501c-4
 - In 2016, a bill was passed which took all rights from municipalities for regulating short-term rentals
 - Neighborhood Alliance is looking for feedback from neighborhoods to present to the City
 - Short-term rentals are having a negative economic effect, squeezing out lower cost housing options for teachers and other local workforce, generating exponential increase in calls for police assistance,
 - AZ is leading the nation in single family rent increase by 19% over past year
 - If there is an issue, need to call the Phx Police non emergency number so police can collect data.
- <u>Jared</u>: the problem is that the law doesn't give the police any "teeth". Every city has to take care of the violations/ problems on their own.

Preservation - Tristahn Schaub and team

- Camelback Church of Christ 4x8' Digital Display 10/14 Tristahn and Chris Totton
 - Chris Totton-- from billboard company, Bootz and Duke, representing the church
 - From the ground the sign will be 7' tall
 - The light projected from the sign will be directed down
 - The hearing will be for the rotation of messages of upcoming events, promotions, church services, etc.
 - Neighbor at 4539 n 52 PL. input: worried that Camelback Rd becoming too "Vegas"-ish.
 - The colors matter
 - The time must turn off 11pm
 - The sign is allowed to rotate a message every 8 seconds
 - Stipulate that the sign never be used for commercial advertising/ anything other than church-related events etc.
 - Messages must be static-- no movement or animation
 - Marvin- believes it's a degradation of the neighborhood, the church should have come to the Board Meeting rather than have a representative from the sign company answer questions
 - Steve Serrano, neighbor- it appears that the church is concerned about how the neighborhood feels, but did not consult w/ anyone or come to our meeting. If there was going to be a dialogue about the sign, the church should have brought neighbors into discussions at the beginning. Why is a digital sign necessary?
 - <u>Liz neighbor</u> technical question: do the lights dim at night/ not as bright.
 Several neighbors have bedrooms bordering the church property
 - <u>Tristahn</u>- ACMNA will request the sign shut off by 9pm and not change more than 1x/ hr.
- Becker Boards 42_{nd}/Indian School BOA 12/2, Maricopa Supervisors 11/17 <u>Neil Hadad</u> applicant has appealed. Continuance til December b/c they have a new attorney. The law is on our side. It's w/in 500' of residential.
- 4701 E Calle Redonda (withdrawn) <u>Marvin and Adam</u> wanted to build a 2nd floor. The CC&Rs said no and the property owner withdrew.
- 5195 E Camelback Rd (R35 lot split) Tristahn ACMNA did not oppose
